A few short years later, his music landed in the hands of jazz mogul Wynton Marsalis. Marsalis steered Mr. Echols and introduced him to Juilliard Professor and Director of Programming at Jazz at Lincoln Center, Antonio Ciacca. Over the next three years Echols was mentored by Ciacca and introduced to the international jazz scene. Immediately he traveled to Italy for more serious study. Justin attended master classes with notable jazz greats Dave Liebman, Dado Maroni, and Antonio Ciacca himself. Mr. Echols soon began frequent touring throughout Europe landing concerts in Germany, Poland, The Czech Republic, Slovakia, Istanbul and many more.

In 2012, Justin Echols became the youngest inductee into the Oklahoma Jazz Hall of Fame, he was the cover story of Making Music Magazine, recorded his first album and was featured on Forbes.com as a must-see jazz artist. In 2018, Justin's story was nominated for a local Emmy for a special segment on PBS called "Meant To Be". In January 2020, Mr. Echols received the prestigious Native Son Award from the South OKC Chamber, solidifying him as one of the most distinguished artists in the State of Oklahoma.


### Big Fish Tales, Made of Hooks and Scales





# Acceptance of Autism at Oklahoma **Integrated Care** is in Action

April is Autism Acceptance Month, formerly known as Autism Awareness Month. It is time to raise awareness and accept the disorder that impacts one in every 54 children in the US.

ASD, often known as autism spectrum disorder, is a general term used to describe a group of illnesses marked by difficulties with speech, nonverbal communication, repetitive activities, and social skills. The Centers for Disease Control estimate that one in every 36 children and one in every 45 adults in the US currently suffer from autism.

Autism is a complicated developmental illness with several subtypes that influence a patient's ability to interact, communicate, and progress. First recognized by the Autism Society in 1972, Autism Acceptance Month draws attention to the importance of raising public awareness in order to promote acceptance, celebrate diversity, and foster a more accepting environment for individuals with autism in our community.

In order to reframe the debate about autism and move away from stigmatizing language that portrays autism as a problem that needs to be addressed with caution, the autistic community founded Autism Acceptance Month.

At the beginning of Autism Acceptance Month over a decade ago, advocacy groups led by those without autism openly discussed their goal of achieving a day when autism is considered a historical term. As opposed to this, autism acceptance stresses that individuals with autism are part of society and should have equal access to opportunities, inclusive jobs and schools, and friendly neighborhoods. There has been significant advancement in the past ten years. Initially opposed to the use of terminology associated with "acceptance," many autism organizations led by nonautistic individuals have eventually come to embrace it. We are happy about this modification.

But acceptance is a behavior that involves more than just altering our vocabulary. Autism organizations need to shift their perspectives on autism and their efforts to advocate for individuals with autism if they are to genuinely practice autism acceptance. Recognizing ourselves as a key constituency—rather than just our family members—is essential to working toward acceptance.

It indicates that autism acceptance does not include supporting practices that individuals with autism frequently characterize as harmful, such as institutionalization, applied behavior analysis, or research aimed at "curing" or preventing autism. Advocating for autism acceptance entails confronting people who propagate discredited anti-vaccine rhetoric, harass self-advocates, or seek to increase the number of segregated environments, such as sheltered workshops and institutions.

Misconceptions regarding autism and the pervasiveness of exclusion today threaten the vital information, resources, and support that people with autism and their families need. Oklahoma Integrated Care recognizes that individuals with autism should have opportunities to be recognized and given the respect they merit on a daily basis, not just once a year.
